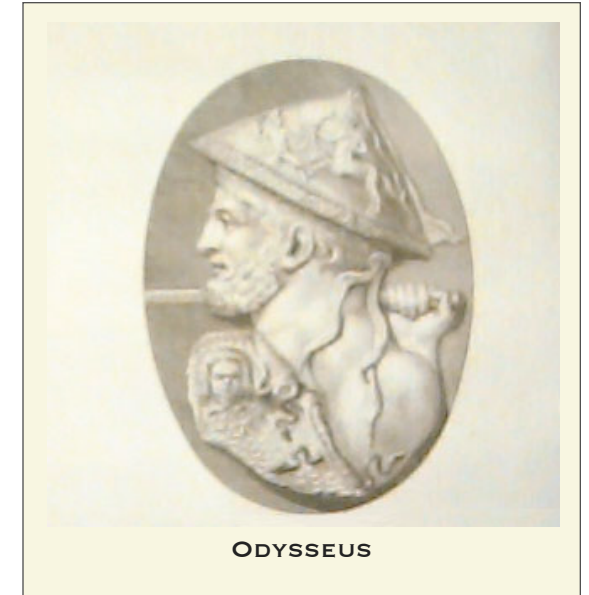

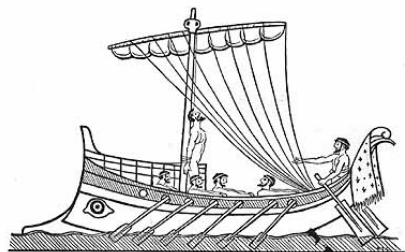
## “The Odyssey - The Journey of a Soul”

“When the battle was over, there were few of us left to celebrate our victory. And after ten years of fighting, we didn’t feel much like celebrating anyway. We were tired and we wanted to go home.”

So starts the journey that takes Odysseus and his crew through tests of wisdom, bravery, and humility as they struggle to reach their home across the tumultuous sea. They meet a one-eyed cyclops, sirens, lotus eaters, the enchantress Circe, the monster Scylla, the whirlpool Charybdis, and the oracle Tiresias as they struggle to reach their destination and to overcome their personal demons.

### ART IN THE AFTERNOONS

Afternoons at Theatre Camp are set aside for art projects that support the focus on the Greek theme. When you are not working on scene work, you may design a mask to use as part of your costume, put together a mosaic from colorful tiles, sculpt a fresco, sew a toga, prepare Greek foods to serve at the feast, learn to dance the hasapikos and the miserlou, sing a Greek folk song, learn about Greek architecture, lounge around, eat grapes - and enjoy!
